

All right! Summer's officially here and there's a long list of Qualifiers to try to attend. With the Championships back on the West Coast this year I've established getting qualified as a "must happen" goal. I feel fortunate to live in the Pacific Northwest where we have 5 qualifiers scheduled. Of course, some of those would involve 15 hour drives for me, so sadly I will not be able to attend them all. I did have the opportunity to attend the 2cd annual Sanderson Field Scale rally in Shelton, WA, and am looking forward to the Oregon Scale Fly-In & USSMA Challenge in North Plains, OR and the Best in the West in Wenatchee, WA.

Craig Ferguson, a late night TV show host, used to ask at the end of his show, "What did we learn tonight?" Well, so far this summer I've learned that you always have to be ready for the unexpected and maybe a bit of disappointment. After 3 years on the work bench I finally got my 1/3 scale Fly Baby in the air....briefly. I did have 7 flights, but each flight involved some difficulties with the big OS FF-320 Pegasus engine I have in it. It survived the first 6 flights, but unlucky number 7 found the engine losing power with a stiff tailwind. You got it....stall....crash. I hope to have it back in the air again in time for the Best in the West and of course the Championships. What else did I learn? 1) ALWAYS make sure you filter your fuel as you fill your tank and use an in-line fuel filter or use a sintered brass fuel pick-up; 2) ALWAYS make sure you have adequate fuel flow/feed to your engine; and 3) After spending 3 years building a model the rebuild goes 10 times faster because you previously figured out how to do all the hard stuff....and if you're lucky you can salvage most of the detail parts.

Looking ahead I'd like to put out feelers for someone to take over as CD for the Oregon Scale Fly-In & USSMA Challenge, or to start a new event in Oregon. It would be great if someone a bit younger than me and full of energy could take charge as CD for a regional event and recruit and train a fresh batch of contestants

and judges. Scale is evolving. We're seeing more and more quality ARF's. Competition seems to be evolving towards more emphasis on flying and less on modeling. I'd like to ask those that embrace the evolution to lead, and let the dinosaurs play for awhile then rest a bit before they turn into oil. Don't be shy! I'd be happy to advise and work with anyone interested in the challenge.

Onward to the Championships!


